I HAVE JUST RETURNED FROM ST PETERSBURG, WHERE I **EXPERIENCED SOMETHING OF A** RUSSIAN BEER REVOLUTION.

We rightly laud the growth of new breweries in many parts of Europe, North and South American and Asia. However, many might not realise that Russia now has 700 plus craft brewers — and the discussions as to what a 'craft' brewer is are as profound and energetic as they are here.

At one event more than 60 home and commercial home brewers had grouped to together to showcase their creations.

There were beers made with lingonberries and ginger, imperial stouts, wood-aged beers in barrels which once contained homemade spirits and of course lots of IPAs laden with hops. The brewers were enthusiastic, informed and keen to learn more. And there were lots of collaborations between brewers eager to share knowledge and develop their skills while increasing consumers' awareness of beer.

There is also a developing bar culture too — with many of the young entrepreneurs involved seeing beer as a way of expressing a commitment to their local community, which helps to create employment.

Brewers Association Welcome to the US Brewers Association (BA), which has become the latest group to become corporate members of the Guild. The BA is a not-for-profit trade association dedicated to small and



independent American brewers, their beers and the community of brewing enthusiasts. It represents more than 3,000 brewers.

Its Brewers Publications publishing arm also produces some great books. The latest, Wood & Beer: A Brewer's Guide, by brewing luminaries Dick Cantwell and Peter Bouckaert, explores the many influences of wood as a vehicle for contributing tremendous complexity to beers fermented and aged within it. From the souring effects of microbes that take up residence in the wood to the character drawn from barrels, or foeders, the book covers the history, physiology, microbiology and flavour contributions of wood. The focus of Beer Day Britain is the National Cheers to Beer that happens at 7pm when people are asked to raise a glass of beer and send a Tweet or Instagram with the hashtag #CheersToBeer. Last year the National Cheers trended on Twitter so we hope to do that again.

New this year is an anthem to beer for people to sing during the National Cheers and at any other time that they feel the urge.
